Just some advices to help you at the beginning of your Italian experience

1. WHERE WE ARE

1.1 How to reach Tor Vergata

Step 1) Your arrival could be through:

- "Leonardo Da Vinci International Airport" also known as "Fiumicino International Airport", is Italy's largest airport, it is only 32 km away from the centre of Rome and you can reach the centre of the city by train, taxi or getting special shuttle transfers.
- "G.B. Pastine Roma Ciampino Airport" is situated in Via Appia Nuova, 15 km from the centre of Rome. It is a short distance from the Rome city ring road (GRA) and offers all the means of transport to get to the capital.

Both airports are connected with the city centre and give you the opportunity to get the metro line you need to reach Tor Vergata University.

Step 2) Subway: Line "A" direction Anagnina and get off at Anagnina Station, from here you can:

Line 20 express to all the Schools. Direction: via Cambellotti (Tor Bella Monaca) Line 500 to: Mathematical, Physical and Natural Sciences, Medicine and Surgery. Last stop: Tor Vergata Policlinico

Line 506 to: via V. Vanvitelli (Economics)

Line 507: to Grotte Celoni. Other stops: Economics, Medicine and Surgery Line 046 to: via M. Raimondi. Other stops: Mathematical, Physical and Natural Sciences

1.2 How to reach the International Mobility Student/Erasmus+ Office The office is located in the Rectorate building in via Cracovia, building D, floor 0, room 002.



1.3 Residence permit (for Extra European Students)

Residence permit is required by law if your stay in Italy is longer than 90 days.

Within 8 days from arrival, all non-Eu citizens who hold a study visa for Italy must apply fora stay permit for study purposes.

The stay permit is issued by the local police station (Questura - Ufficio Stranieri) but according to the most recent regulation application, now it can be delivered to authorized Post Offices.

The Post Officer will identify you; you will then have to pay \notin 70,46 (paid through postal money transfer - *bollettino postale*) for the issuing of the electronic version of the document and \notin 30,00 for the service (to be paid directly to the Post officer).

Moreover you should buy a € 16 stamp (*marca da bollo*).

The Post office will leave you a receipt of the Stay permit application. Anyway the stay permit is issued against presentation of:

- · Copy of the invitation letter
- \cdot Copy of the passport (all pages)

 \cdot a document giving evidence of your right to medical care in Italy (go to 1.5 **Health Insurance**).



1.4 How to obtain an Italian Fiscal Code

The Italian Fiscal Code is a personal code that identifies each person within the Italian State. You need it to open a bank account, or to get a cellular phone. To obtain the tax code we recommend to ask for it at the Italian Embassy at the moment you ask the Visa (faster way!) or once you are here in Rome you will need to complete a request form and apply to the "Agenzia delle Entrate" with a valid identity document (ex: passport, stay permit, visa). The tax code is usually issued immediately.

1.5 How to get health insurance

National health insurance in Italy is managed by the National Health Service (*Servizio Sanitario Nazionale*, SSN).

Registration is handled at a local level by the Local Health Service (*Azienda Sanitaria Locale*, ASL) which issues a social security number and a health card (*Tessera Sanitaria*). This entitles the holder to low or no-cost treatment. Hospital services are provided free and a 75 percent reduction is given on the cost of outpatient and some dental treatment.

1.6 How to open a bank account

If you need to open a bank account you should go to one of the local banks at your choice with the following documents:

- Residence permit;
- Italian Fiscal Code;
- Certificate of university enrolment at Tor Vergata;
- Identity document or passport.

The ECTS grading scale:

is a grading system defined in the European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System (ECTS) framework by the European Commission. The ECTS grading scale has been developed to provide a common measure and facilitate the transfer of students and their grades between European higher education institutions, by allowing national and local grading systems to be interchangeable. Grades are reported on a carefully calibrated and uniform A-to-F scale combined with keywords and short qualitative definitions. Each institution makes its own decision on how to apply the ECTS grading scale to its system. The ECTS grade is indicated alongside the mark awarded by the host institution on the student's transcript of records. The receiving institutions then convert the ECTS grade to their own system.

Credits (CFU) are units that are used to measure the total amount of coursework required from a student. 1 CFU corresponds to 25 hours of work.

An academic year requires a total of 60 CFU. Credits are obtained by passing examinations or through other forms of assessment established by each university.

The University of Rome Tor Vergata is a public University, established in 1981 located in the Southeastern of Rome. The aim of Tor Vergata has been to create a "new" university with vast open-air and indoor areas and good students/teacher relations and balance. Tor Vergata is also one of the largest research based institutions in Italy and a well-known international center for research and education. Moreover, the University Hospital is a flagship of the University. It is well equipped with diagnostic and therapeutic vanguard structures and it has become a reference model at the national and international level our community is composed by 39.000 students, 1.335 academics, 980 administrative staff.

Our six Schools offers 112 Degree courses, 31 PhDs and 214 Specialisation Courses, 18 degree courses entirely taught in English.
